Variety: Grenache *Vintage:* 2023 *Region:* Barossa, South Australia *Alcohol:* 14.5%

The Founder's View range brings in the best of our grower fruit into these blends allowing flexibility in finding that ultimate blend. They are trusted partnerships with growers who we have worked with for years. We take grapes sourced from a range of vineyards, to enable us to build layers into the wine aiming for complex and complete wines. Chief winemaker Tim Heath, crafts harmonious balance, drawing on each of the sites unique characters.

Vineyard

The grapes are picked from select vineyards within several sub-regions of the Barossa - picked earlier to capture freshness. We draw on the best fruit to ensure concentration and richness and to allow true expression of the Barossa region and variety.

Winemaking

Gentle maceration at cooler temperature to retain bright fruit character. A small amount of oak used to soften out components and give some complexity. Youthful and aromatic fruit profile. Some whole bunch fermentation used to create a wine with layers of complexity.

Colour

A vibrant, bright crimson hue.

Nose

This wine shows lifted red cherry and raspberry fruit aromatics with subtle toasty oak and spice notes.

Palate

Medium-bodied and beautifully textured profile, the palate is succulent and juicy, with raspberry confectionery and red berry fruit flavours balanced by pepper and spice notes, and premium French oak.

Cellaring

Drinks well now, or will reward cellaring for the mid-term (36 - 48 months).

Vintage 2023

Barossa's 2023 vintage was significantly delayed, starting 3-4 weeks later than the 'new normal' of recent decades, with harvest extending into May for some sites. The region experienced one of its wettest springs on record, with 131% above-average rainfall and 53 rain days. Summer was mild, with no heatwaves and below-average rainfall, delaying veraison until February. Harvest began in mid-March for early reds, with sporadic rainfall events in March and April. While yields varied across the region, the final tally was slightly above-average. The season's challenges ultimately resulted in reds with intense, rich flavors.
